Lia Tarachansky is an Israeli [filmmaker](#) and the former Israel/Palestine correspondent for [The Real News Network](#) (TRNN) where she produced short, documentary-style reports exploring the context behind the news. She has directed several documentaries that tackle different aspects of social justice struggles in Israel/Palestine.

Her 2012 documentary for BBC World profiles the Israeli version of the Occupy Wall Street movement; in 2013 she released [ON THE SIDE OF THE ROAD](#), a film about Israeli collective denial of the mass displacement of Palestinians in 1948, and in 2015 she released [ETHNOCRACY: ISRAEL'S AFRICAN REFUGEES](#) about the Netanyahu government's five-point plan to make Israel a refugee-free nation. Most recently, she directed a short film, [OCEAN](#), about her experience, inheriting the sounds of the 2014 war, which she covered as a journalist, while living in the sights of her new home in Toronto. The film premiered at the 2017 Toronto Short Film Festival.

Tarachansky's work is frequently featured in publications such as [+972 Magazine](#), [Mondoweiss](#), [USA Today](#), [Al Jazeera](#), and the [Huffington Post](#).
